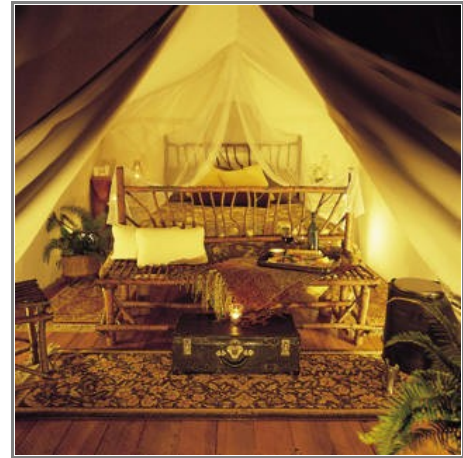

Arriving late at Vancouver International Airport?

Simply get yourself to Vancouver, British Columbia and we'll take care of everything else. Guests flying in from Vancouver enjoy VIP guest services from the preferred seaplane partner, Sea Air on specific resort-chartered flights. The flights depart from the Sea Air Terminal at the South Terminal Compound of Vancouver International Airport. All costs for Vancouver-Outpost return seaplane fares are included in resort package pricing as described and seaplane arrangements are made by resort reservations representatives. The scenic 45-minute flight takes resort guests over the gorgeous Gulf Islands and the beautiful Vancouver Island mountain range. As you descend toward Canada's western-most edge, the majesty of Pacific Rim National Park, the Village of Tofino and the Clayoquot Sound Biosphere appear below in brilliant technicolour. Soon you land at the Outpost dock where resort staff welcome you home.

What you can expect:

Guests wanting the temperate rain forest interpretation of an Out of Africa dining experience convene to one of two dining tents. The Bistro tent hosts new friends, couples and foursomes, while the Family tent hosts communal groups or parties of up to 12 at one great long table. Guests travelling alone or those keen to chat with the Chef-in-action often dine at the open-kitchen bar in the great room.

Philosophy of Modern Natural Cuisine

When Chef May decided to take the helm at Clayoquot Wilderness Resort 10 years ago, he set about creating an identity for his food. Because the resort started out on a floating barge, with a kitchen the size of a pantry station, he knew he needed a unique vision to help it grow. Dining at either Clayoquot resort is not for the faint of heart. Dinners are five-course seafood-anchored undertakings that include feature B.C. wine-pairings, home-baked breads, BBQ, indulgent desserts and friendly, anticipatory service.

Daily wilderness activities are highly personalized and customized based on each guest's experience level, willingness and desires. This means no "signing up" for particular activities in advance and the ability to choose what you want to do each day.

Every evening our Activities Directors will sit with you personally and design your adventures for the next day depending on weather, tidal charts, animal sightings and your willingness to go wild!

As Clayoquot specializes in remote experiences, guests may choose to be taken to a pristine and secluded beach to learn how to surf, have a First Nations guide escort them on a day long hike to the "Wild Side" interpretive trail and Flores Island, take on a mountain fed rushing river in a kayak, or experience a gentler ocean kayak cruise to private inlets and hidden coves.

Horsemanship and riding are signatures of the resort, with a range of talented horses for the beginner to the expert rider. Wildlife viewing is also part of daily life, whether guests go in search of black bears and whales or see the wildlife on the outskirts of camp, kept there by a team of well trained and well loved dogs.

At around six o'clock each evening, following post-activity naps and all manner of massage, special cocktails and hors d'oeuvres ring in the social hour, and guests mingle in the great room to exchange tales of adventure and make new friends.

2010 Elder's Package

A popular destination for multi-generational families, Clayoquot Wilderness Resort is paying tribute to the oldest and wisest family members with an Elders Package that offers a free stay for up to two elders, aged 55 years or older, travelling with families of six or more. The special offer is designed to encourage even more families to reconnect in the magic of the Canadian wilderness and is inspired by the First Nations culture, in which elders are revered as role models and leaders for future generations.

The Elder Package runs from May to September 2010 and covers the cost of the stay for up to two elder family members, excluding the cost of the Float plane trip from Vancouver to the resort. Rates for other family members start at CDN \$4750.00 (US \$3774.00*) for a three night all inclusive package. Rates for our four and seven night stays are also available.

About the Outpost Camp:

Bordering Strathcona Provincial Park just nine kilometres by boat from Quait Bay is the Wilderness Outpost on the gorgeous Bedwell River.

Visit this 21st-century-safari style enclave of ten ultra luxurious sleeping, dining, lounge and massage tents. Guest quarters are roomy prospector style white canvas tents on raised wooden platforms, complete with remote-controlled propane wood stoves, a/c power, Adirondack queen or twin beds with down duvets, antique furnishings and accessories, oil lamps and opulent rugs. Generous porches overlook the river. Cedar boardwalks link the discreetly situated guest tents to the dining tents, lounge tents, massage tent, kitchen roundhouse and shower facilities. A windmill-powered generator provides a/c power and hot and cold running water to showers and sinks.
